^{2.} Lucifer was a powerful high-echelon archangel who was one of the most brilliant and beautiful of all created beings in heaven. But this angel was not content with his position – he wanted supreme authority – the highest station. Some scholars maintain that the reason behind his conceit was that he was angry that God's newest creation, the human being, would have a higher station than he had, even though he had been created first. He was the ultimate narcissist, having deluded himself into the utterly irrational hope that he could replace God as the ruler of all existence. So he led a rebellion against God – and thankfully he was defeated. As a result, he was expelled from heaven, along with all the other angels who had joined in his rebellion [see Isaiah 14:13-15 and Luke 10:18].
